At the April 21 TPB meeting, notice was provided that the TPB intends to amend its bylaws to change the name of the Program Committee to "Steering Committee," as shown in the enclosed materials. As required under Section X of the Bylaws, the approval of the TPB this proposed amendment was recorded in the minutes at the May 19, 2004 meeting. A special written notice on the proposed amendment was mailed to every member of the TPB at least ten days before the June 16 meeting. The Board will be asked to adopt the proposed amendment at the June 16 meeting.

Action: Approve proposed amendment to the TPB bylaws.

INFORMATION ITEMS

> In April 2002, the TPB approved a process for an independent review of the region's travel modeling procedures. The process called for the TPB to engage the TRB in appointing a review committee and overseeing the review process. The TRB committee began its analysis of the TPB modeling procedures in January 2003 and submitted its first letter report on September 8. 2003. TPB staff provided comments on this first letter report in a letter of September 8, 2003 to the chairman of the TRB Committee. On December 24, 2003 TPB staff provided a detailed models development work program to the TRB Committee for its consideration in the second phase of the review process. The TRB Committee completed its review with the submission to TPB of the second letter report on May 10, 2004. The Board will be briefed on the second letter report, and on the TPB staff comments on the second letter report and on the overall review process.

At the April 21 meeting, the Board approved the project submissions for inclusion in the conformity analysis for the 2004 CLRP and FY 2005-2010 TIP and also approved the scope of work for the air quality conformity analysis. The Board will be briefed on the status of the draft 2004 CLRP and FY 2005-2010 TIP documents and the associated conformity analysis, which are currently scheduled to be released for public comment on July 21, 2004.

1:20 pm 10. Status Report of the Task Force on Value Pricing for Transportation in the Washington Region

At the July 16, 2003 meeting, the Board established a task force to examine how value pricing could benefit the Washington region following the June 4, 2003 TPB conference on providing new transportation choices through innovative pricing strategies. The task force has reviewed pricing strategies being implemented in the U.S. and international locations, and is developing a variable priced lanes scenario for testing in the Regional Mobility and Accessibility Study. The Board will be briefed on the recent activities of the task force and the activities to be completed by the end of the year.

Center on Urban and Metropolitan Policy, The Bookings Institution

The Board will be briefed on the enclosed research report: "Washington's Metro: Deficits by Design." The report examines the revenue structure of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) and identifies the need for a dedicated revenue source. It describes a number of potential dedicated revenue sources that could be considered.
