TPB Freight Subcommittee



The TRB held its summer meeting in Boston July 10th-13th, 2011. Several freight committees met. The Debt Ceiling Debate Impacts Transportation Big Time

On Friday, July 22, 2011, the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) reauthorization expired at midnight. Congress normally extends the program without controversy, as it has 20 separate times. With Congress consumed in the debt ceiling debate, the deadline came and went. “Because of [Congress’] inaction, states and airports won’t be able to work on their construction projects, and too many people will have to go without a paycheck. This is no way to run the best aviation system in the world” said Secretary Ray LaHood. The FAA was forced to furlough (leave without pay) 4,000 employees and will be unable to move forward on important airport construction projects until funding is in place. The 4,000 FAA employees work in 35 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. Furloughed employees includes engineers, scientists, research analysts, administrative assistants, computer specialists, program managers, environmental specialists, and community planners. It is important to note that the safety of the flying public is said not to be compromised.
