**Jonathan Rogers**

Jonathan M. Rogers is the project manager for Vision Zero at the District Department of Transportation (DDOT). In DDOT's Policy and Legislative Affairs Division, Jonathan leads multi-agency coordination for Vision Zero, and formulates policies and regulatory proposals that pertain to the development of transportation systems for the District of Columbia, with particular emphasis on a safe, multi-modal comprehensive approach.

Tom Gianni serves as the Chief of MDOT's Maryland Highway Safety Office, a division of the MVA. A twenty-five year veteran police officer; Tom retired in 2003 as a lieutenant from the Mt. Lebanon (Pennsylvania) Police Department, a suburb of Pittsburgh. He has been with the Maryland Highway Safety Office since 2003 and has been its Chief for the past five years. In addition to co-authoring several highway safety articles in Police Chief Magazine he has given presentations across the country on a variety of highway safety topics.

Wade Holland is a Performance Management and Data Analyst within the Offices of the County Executive in Montgomery County, MD. In his role, he is the lead data analyst for the Pedestrian Safety Initiative and Vision Zero.
