### What is the TIP?

- Six-year federal funding obligation document
  - Funding in the first two fiscal years must be "available and committed"
- Agency's intent to construct or implement projects
- Identifies anticipated flow of federal and matching funds
- Multimodal: roadway, transit, bicycle & pedestrian projects and maintenance/operational programs, ITS, safety, etc.
- Formally updated every two years
  - Amended and modified on a weekly/monthly basis




## Development of the FY 2019-2024 TIP

- October 18, 2017 TPB approves Technical Inputs Solicitation Submission Guide
- March 2, 2018 FY 19-24 TIP inputs due
- July 12, 2018 Public Forum on the development of the FY 19-24 TIP
- September 7 October 7, 2018 Public comment period
- October 17, 2018 TPB asked to approve the FY 19-24 TIP



## Development of the FY 2019-2024 TIP

- Technical Inputs Solicitation Submission Guide approved by TPB on October 18, 2017
- Regional Policy Framework
  - TPB Vision, Region Forward, RTPP, aspirational initiatives
- Federal Requirements
  - Ten Planning Factors
  - Financial Constraint
  - Air Quality Conformity
  - Public Participation
  - Title VI/Environmental Justice
  - Congestion Management Process
  - Performance-Based Planning and Programming





## FUNDING SOURCES BY JURISDICTION








## **Summary and Analysis of Projects**

#### **Complete Streets Documentation**

- 2012 TPB Resolution: "implementation of member jurisdiction and agency Complete Streets policies will be documented in the regional Transportation Improvement Program."
- All agencies reported that their jurisdiction has a Complete Streets policy
- Of 300 project records
  - 15 records with Complete Streets responses
    - 10 advance Complete Streets goals
    - 5 not applicable



## **Summary and Analysis of Projects**

#### **Bicycle and Pedestrian Projects and Accommodations**

- TPB has set a goal to increase the rate of construction of bicycle and pedestrian facilities in the region
  - Track progress in the TIP
- Of 300 project records
  - 28 are "primarily bicycle and/or pedestrian project"
    - Half of those are project groupings or area-wide programs
    - \$187 million programmed for these projects
  - 29 roadway, transit, or other project type reported to include bicycle and/or pedestrian accommodations.



## Performance-Based Planning & Programming

- First TIP developed since Performance-Based Planning and Programming (PBPP) requirements have been in effect
- Baseline for future TIPs
- FY 2019-2024 TIP will contain federally-required language reflecting the performance based planning process, including for the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) and Transit Asset Management
  - FY 2017-2022 has been modified to include HSIP language and will be modified to include TAM language to hold over until EPA approves the conformity determination for Visualize 2045 and the FY 2019-2024 TIP

- Continue PBPP analysis
- Approval by TPB on October 17, 2018
  - Amend into DC, MD, and VA STIPs December/January
