Recommendations

As a regional leader devoted to the goal of reducing greenhouse gas emissions and promoting sustainable development, and based on the recommendation of the Climate Change Steering Committee (CCSC), I recommend that COG adopt a two-fold approach for joining the Cool Capital Challenge.

First, COG should encourage our members to participate in the Cool Capital Challenge, which will not only raise awareness of our regional governments' efforts to combat climate change, but also empower citizens and organizations to personally and individually pledge by April 2008 to take steps to contribute to the region's greater goal of reducing one billion pounds of green house gas emissions.

Second, it is my plan that COG, as a corporate entity, will build upon its green practices already underway, and utilize the knowledge and creativity of our staff members to take part in the Challenge over the course of 2008 and beyond.

Green Practices Currently Underway

As a one-third owner of 777 North Capitol Street, NE, COG has collaborated with building partners and building management, and has taken numerous critical steps toward water and energy efficiency and technological improvements in COG's headquarters building and commuting practices. These practices include recycling measures, lighting controls, building engineering, and commuting policies and options. They are listed in greater depth on page 4 of this memo.
