# **Background**

- Traffic Incident Management Enhancement (TIME) Task Force Formed at direction of COG Board of Directors in 2018.
- Seven priority items identified in the report:
  - Update Regional Agreements and Improve Consistency of TIM Laws and Policies.
  - 2. Coordinate Regional Annual TIM Self-Assessments.
  - 3. Encourage and Coordinate TIM Trainings to Promote Best Practices.
  - 4. Launch Outreach Initiatives That Better Engage the Public and Officials on TIM.
  - 5. Create a Regional TIM Program.
  - 6. Designate Transportation Incident Responders as Emergency Responders Regionwide.
  - Expand Roadway Service Patrols to Federal Parkways and Other Critical Major Roads Not Currently Covered.



#### TPB REGIONAL TIM SELF-ASSESSMENT

- Conducted in November of 2023.
- With renewed TIM work by member agencies seen as the easiest of the TTF recommendations to accomplish.
- TPB staff decision to start with transportation focus and add other disciplines in future.
- Representatives from the three TPB State DOT members, Joe Warner from VDOT,
   Charles Tenbrook from DDOT, and Eric Fogle from MDOT, as well as Taran Hutchinson from MATOC.
- Many thanks to Eileen Singleton from Baltimore Metropolitan Council's TIMBR Committee.



## FHWA TIM Capability Maturity Self-Assessment Tool

- Developed by the U.S. DOT Federal Highway Administration with input from state DOTs, law enforcement, and other TIM responders.
- Not a benchmarking tool.
- In use since 2003.
- Currently 41 questions broken into 7 categories.
  - 1. Formal TIM Programs.
  - 2. TIM Training and After-Action Reviews.
  - 3. TIM Performance Measures.
  - 4. TIM Laws.
  - 5. Policies and Procedures for Incident Response and Clearance.
  - 6. Responder and Motorists Safety.
  - 7. Support.



#### Results

- The overall score for the region was 71.68.
- Broken down by section:
  - 1. Formal TIM Programs subsection score: **6.96**.
  - TIM Training and After-Action Reviews subsection score: 6.43.
  - 3. TIM Performance Measures subsection score: 11.25.
  - 4. TIM Laws subsection score: 7.28.
  - Policies and Procedures for Incident Response and Clearance subsection score:
     22.5.
  - 6. Responder and Motorists Safety subsection score: 10.59.
  - 7. Support section score: **6.67**.



### **Next Steps**

- TPB staff will continue to support TIM implementation in the NCR region.
- Continue to look for opportunities to implement other Time Task Force recommendations in NCR.
- Host future self-assessments on a biennial schedule.
