In June 2010, Fairfax County adopted a new Comprehensive Plan for Tysons that re-envisions the area as a series of walkable urban neighborhoods centered on four new Metro stations. In addition to encouraging transit-oriented densities and mixed use development, the plan sets bold goals for workforce housing, environmental stewardship, and multi-modal transportation networks. Following the plan's adoption, Fairfax County turned its efforts to implementation, including processing over a dozen rezoning applications and creating detailed parks and public facility plans, urban design guidelines, and street design standards.
