5. NCR RESILENCE TO CYBER SECURITY

Gail Bohan will provide an update regarding the development of a Cyber Security Framework for the National Capital Region (NCR). The Framework is intended to develop policies, standards, and procedures that will provide a unified approach to cyber security in the NCR. When completed, this Framework will include recommended information technology policies, standards (management, technical, operational controls), and step-by-step procedures laying out how the standards can be attained. Chairman Quander will lead the EPC in a discussion on the outcomes of the Framework. Additionally, Chairman Quander will discuss having the EPC SLS based on a cyber scenario that would inform and identify gaps that should be addressed in a Cyber Security Framework.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: Receive an update regarding development of a NCR Cyber Security Framework, the initial concept for the EPC SLS and provide feedback.
