Please allow enough time before and no later than 11:59 p.m. EDT, April 19, 2010 to complete the IJ in the GRT and submit the required application materials using www.grants.gov.

The National Capital Region (NCR) strategic plan initiative 4.1.3 is to create a regional capability to deal with hazardous materials and decontamination; initiative 4.1.3 deals with standardizing equipment standards to enhance interoperability around the region. This investment will support both of these initiatives by providing standard equipment and training to specialized response teams in local jurisdictions throughout the NCR. This Specialized Response Teams Investment addresses a vital need for local and state tactical teams and bomb squads throughout the National Capital Region (NCR) to be prepared to respond, contain and mitigate terrorist incidents and other non-standard tactical responses, by focusing on the following five (5) initiatives:

- Bomb Team Electronic Countermeasures (Hazmat and Explosive): the FBI and DHS have selected the NCR as one of the regions permitted to acquire the Electronic Countermeasures (ECM) capability to respond to Radio Controlled Improvised Explosive Devices (RCIED); this initiative funds the primary and support ECM equipment, as well as training for Bomb Squads within the NCR.
- Bomb Squad Equipment: by the end of 2010, the NCR bomb squads will have received approximately \$11,500,000.00 worth of highly technical and complex equipment and apparatus, including through 2007 and 2008 UASI funding; this equipment requires extensive maintenance and upgrades to remain viable and available for response.
- CBRNE Detection: this initiative provides a single regional service contract to maintain and repair hazardous materials detection equipment and to provide the supplies necessary to operate this equipment.
- Tactical Team Enhancements: this initiative builds the capabilities of the NCR law enforcement tactical teams through the acquisition of equipment, training and exercises.
- 5. Technical Rescue Team Task Force Equipment & Training: this initiative supports the development of standard equipment caches and response vehicles for technical rescue across the NCR, through the purchase of five (5) vehicles for equipment storage and transport as well as other technical rescue equipment.
