**RESOLUTION ON AN AMENDMENT TO THE FY 2023-2026 TRANSPORTATION
IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) THAT IS EXEMPT FROM THE AIR QUALITY
CONFORMITY REQUIREMENT TO INCLUDE TIP ACTION 23-13.1
WHICH REPROGRAMS FUNDING ON FOUR ONGOING OPERATIONS
AND MAINTENANCE PROGRAMS, AS REQUESTED BY
THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (DDOT)**

WHEREAS, the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB), as the federally designated metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Washington region, has the responsibility under the provisions of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) which was signed into law on November 15, 2021, for developing and carrying out a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process for the metropolitan area; and

WHEREAS, the TIP is required by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) as a basis and condition for all federal funding assistance to state, local and regional agencies for transportation improvements within the Washington planning area; and

WHEREAS, on June 15, 2022 the TPB adopted the FY 2023-2026 TIP; and

WHEREAS, DDOT has requested an amendment to the FY 2023-2026 TIP to include TIP Action 23-13.1 which adds a net total of \$5 million by decreasing funding for the **Safety Improvements Citywide program (T3212)** by \$1.5 million and adding \$6.5 million in funding for a new **Traffic Safety Input program (T11625)** and reprogramming \$495,000 from the **Retroreflective Backplates program (T6811)** to the **Traffic Signal Maintenance Program (T5347)**, as described in the attached materials; and

WHEREAS, the attached materials include:

- ATTACHMENT A) Program Overview reports showing how the programs will appear in the TIP following approval,
- ATTACHMENT B) Amendment Summary report showing the total program costs, the reason for the amendment, and a Change Summary providing line-item changes to every programmed amount by fund source, fiscal year, and project phase, and
- ATTACHMENT C) Letter from DDOT dated February 16, 2023 requesting the amendment; and

WHEREAS, these programs have been entered into the TPB's Project InfoTrak database under TIP Action 23-131, creating the 13th amended version of the FY 2023-2026 TIP, which supersedes all previous versions of the TIP and can be found online at www.mwcog.org/ProjectInfoTrak; and

WHEREAS, these programs are exempt from the air quality conformity requirement; and

WHEREAS, this resolution and amendments to the FY 2023-2026 TIP shall not be considered final until the Transportation Planning Board has had the opportunity to review and accept these materials at its next full meeting.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Steering Committee of the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board amends the FY 2023-2026 TIP to include TIP Action 23-13.1 adds a net total of \$5 million by decreasing funding for the **Safety Improvements Citywide program (T3212)** by \$1.5 million and adding \$6.5 million in funding for a new **Traffic Safety Input program (T11625)** and reprogramming \$495,000 from the **Retroreflective Backplates program (T6811)** to the **Traffic Signal Maintenance Program (T5347)**, as described in the attached materials.

Description This program develops short-term, high-impact measures to improve multi-modal safety and manage and/or calm traffic flow in areas where problems are observed. Through this program, DDOT is able to rapidly investigate, design, and deploy various traffic safety improvements including but not limited to vertical deflections, All-Way Stop Control, Driver Feedback Machines, ATEs, Pedestrian Flashers, Curb Extensions, signs/markings enhancements, roadway conversion (e.g., one-way to two-way), sight distance enhancement measures, road diet etc. The desired outcome is reduction in vehicular speeds, discouraging cut-through traffic, and improving pedestrian safety for bikes, pedestrians, and motorists. a. Description Safety improvements provide a safe traveling environment for vehicular traffic, pedestrians and bicycle circulation within the District on Federal-aid and local roads. Work includes elimination or relocation of roadside visual obstructions; elimination or relocation of roadside obstacles; skid resistance resurfacing; modifications to traffic channeling; median replacement; traffic signals, signs, and lighting upgrades; installation of pavement markings to eliminate or reduce accidents; and installation of safety fences at overhead structures. Safety improvements are systematically identified through analyses of accident records, inspections, surveys, and citizen requests. The District maintains an inventory of locations with the highest number of reported accidents. b. Pavement Skid Testing c. Road Safety Audit Program d. TARAS Crash Analysis Support e. Description The TOSD plans to implement retroreflective backplates as a safety improvement to reduce fatalities and serious injury crashes on the Districts roadways. Retroreflective backplates are FHWA Proven Safety Countermeasure known to reduce total crashes at an intersection by 15%, by providing greater visibility and conspicuity of traffic signal heads, particularly at night and for drivers with vision limitations. The project will include systemic installation of this measure on corridors identified through network screening in each of the eight wards, as well as similar installation for single intersections that demonstrate characteristics and a safety record of crashes susceptible to correction with this treatment.

The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) requests that the FY 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) be amended as detailed below.

- 1. Traffic Signal Management and Design (T5347d)**
 - a. Increase STBG funding for PE in FY23 by \$303,800
- 2. Traffic Signal Transit Priority (T5347g)**
 - a. Decrease STBG funding for PE in FY23 by \$303,800
- 3. Traffic Signal Construction (T5347b)**
 - a. Increase HSIP funding for Construction in FY23 by \$1,995,000
- 4. Traffic Signal Construction (T5347b)**
 - a. Decrease STBG funding for Construction in FY23 by \$1,500,000
- 5. Retroreflective Backplates (T6811)**
 - a. Decrease HSIP funding for PE in FY23 by \$495,000
- 6. Traffic Safety Input – Construction (T11625b)**
 - a. Create subproject b.
 - b. Increase HSIP funding for Construction in FY23 by \$5,000,000
- 7. Traffic Safety Input – Design (T11625a)**
 - a. Create Subproject a.
 - b. Increase STBG funding for PE in FY23 by \$1,500,000
- 8. Road Safety Audit (T3212c)**
 - a. Decrease HSIP funding for PE in FY23 by \$1,500,000

The proposed amendments do not add additional capacity for motorized vehicles and do not require conformity analysis or public review and comment. The funding sources have been identified, and the TIP will remain fiscally constrained. Therefore, DDOT requests that the TPB Steering Committee approve these amendments at its March 3rd meeting.
