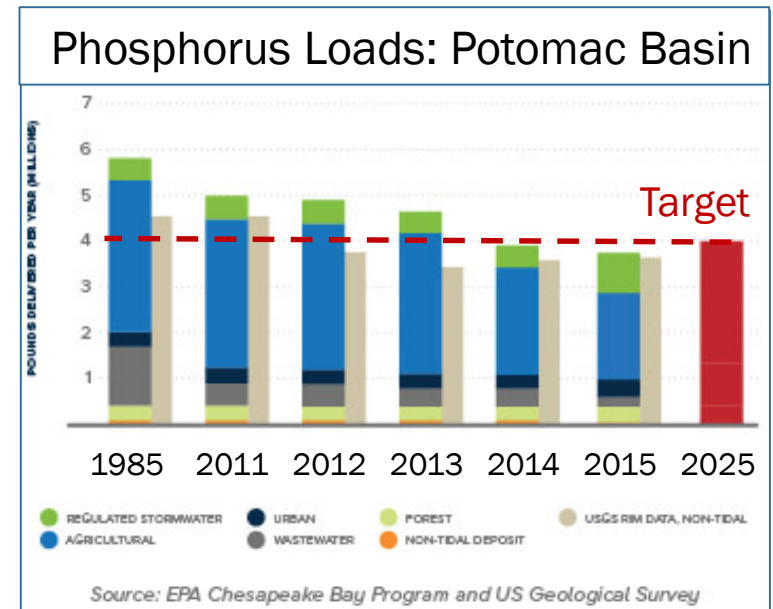

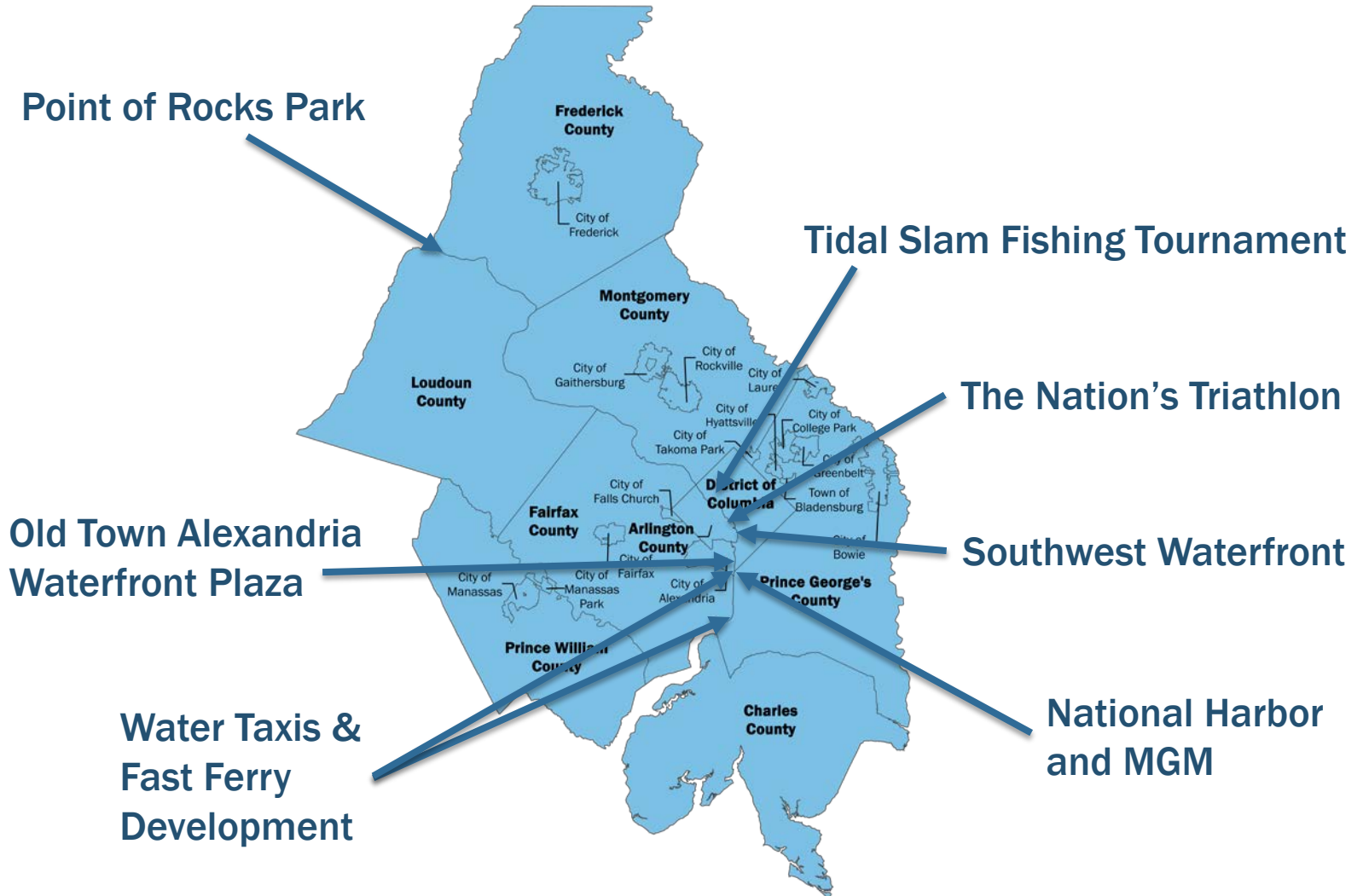


Potomac – Our Drinking Water Source

Over Two-Thirds of the Region's Drinking Water Comes From the Potomac River



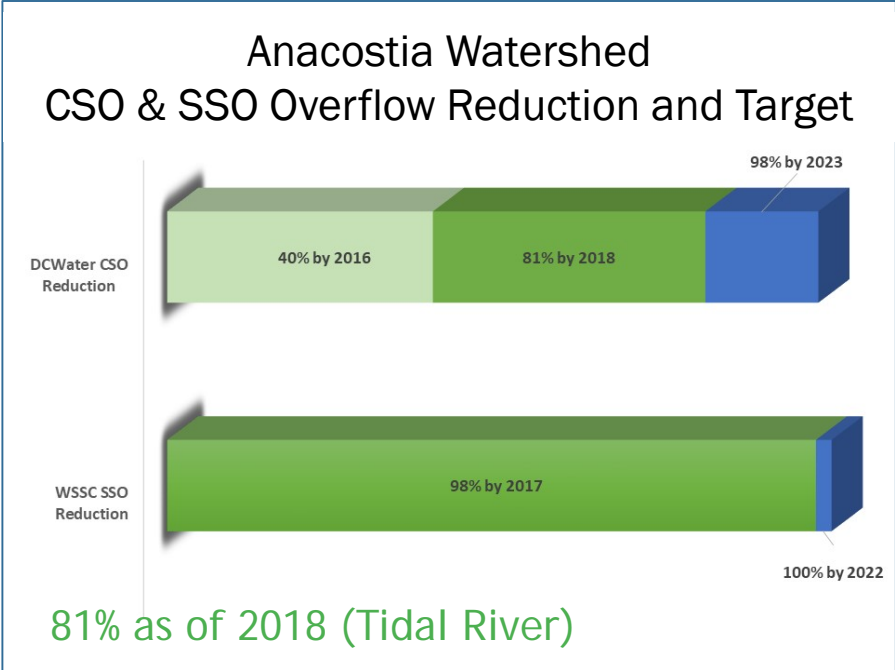
