Summary of Current Drought Conditions in the COG Region

The latest U.S. Drought monitor released on July 5 indicates that the COG region is currently free of drought. Note that the western portion of the Potomac River Basin is experiencing abnormally dry conditions. The areas monitored in the COG region by the Maryland Department of the Environment and the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality are under a normal status. Groundwater levels are normal, streamflow and precipitation levels are slightly below normal, and local reservoirs remain full.
