11:50 A.M. 4. FOOD SECURITY IN FOCUS: VIRGINIA'S ROADMAP TO END HUNGER AND MAXIMIZING ENROLLMENT IN FEDERAL NUTRITION PROGRAMS IN 2021

Virginia's Roadmap to End Hunger was released in the Fall of 2020, following listening sessions and other analysis from Governor Northam's Children's Cabinet. Among other recommendations, the roadmap calls for expanding childhood nutrition programs and maximizing enrollment in SNAP and WIC.

Speakers will highlight plans for working toward these goals in 2021, including observations on how local leaders can help. They will also share how the roadmap connects healthy food access to Virginia's agricultural economy.

At the start of the pandemic, Montgomery County formed a Food Security Task Force to respond to increasing levels of food insecurity. Using CARES Act money, county and other funds, and a data-driven approach, the county and its partners have collaboratively mobilized resources and volunteers in multi-faceted, holistic way. Speakers will provide a high-level overview of how the county's strategy works; highlighting any emerging lessons or key questions of regional interest as the need for food assistance remains high. They will also reflect on challenges and successes in the implementation of federal nutrition benefit programs.
