



- 2019 Passed First Foodware Reduction Ordnance







Litter to Storm Drains



- Water Board Says 0 Litter by 2022
- 67% of Street Litter is Food Packaging
- \$2M for 200 Waste Capture Devices
- Increased Storm Drain Taxes by \$2M

Street Litter in Business Districts



- Telegraph BID Collects 75 Tons of Litter
- 5 Full Time Employees
- Downtown Berkeley Association 7 FTE
- Carts 6 Days a Week = Eyesore

July 1, 2020:

Reusable Foodware for All In-House Dining
