
Crashes are caused by the alignment of factors that can be anticipated and altered.

Therefore, crashes are predictable and preventable!




How many deaths and serious injuries are "acceptable" on our roadways?

What Is An SHSP?

- ✓ Federal requirement under the HSIP
- ✓ Traffic safety plan to reduce fatalities and serious injuries on public roads
- Statewide
- Coordination of efforts among many organizations (federal, state, local, private)
- ✓ Data-driven
- Updated every five years



Visualize 2045 Plan


Long Range Transportation Plan for the National Capital Region



The overall goal of Maryland's highway safety efforts is to eliminate fatalities and serious injuries by 2030 -MD General Assembly Vision Zero, 2019


OVERARCHING GOALS IN THE 2021-2025 SHSP
