


Overview

- 9,000 participating households
- 1,000+ tons collected to date
 - Approx. 2 million lbs.
- **67**% set-out rate
- 97% participant satisfaction rate
- 0.05% contamination rate










Compost Back

- 40,000 lbs. of bagged compost back to participating households
- 4,800 lbs. bulk "donated" to DC Public School gardens and DC Department of Parks and Recreation community gardens











Feedback

Mid-Pilot Year Survey

50% response rate

- 97% Satisfaction Rate
- 54% were not composting at all before joining the Pilot Program
- **36%** noticed that their food waste generation has decreased since joining the Pilot Program
- **81.5**% note that the size of the collection bin is just right

End-of-Pilot Survey

34% response rate


- 98% Satisfaction Rate
- 89% have not needed to use a Food Waste Drop-Off site during the Pilot Program year
- 63.8% surprised by amount of food scraps they were throwing away
- 63.9% noted that separating food scraps from other trash was easier than they anticipated
- 99.3% would recommend this program to a friend, family member or neighbor






- Maintaining services for current participants
