

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO BROWNFIELD COMMUNITIES PROGRAM NJIT TAB

What is TAB?

TAB is a technical assistance program, funded through a cooperative agreement with the USEPA, which is intended to serve as an independent resource to: state, regional, county, tribal and local governments; community organizations; and nonprofits attempting to cleanup and reclaim brownfields.

Who Provides TAB Services?

The New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT) maintains a multi-disciplinary professional team of planners, engineers, and environmental scientists with academic research, government, industry, and consulting experience available to assist communities with their brownfield projects.

Who Can Receive TAB Assistance?

Services are FREE to state, regional, county, tribal and local governments; community organizations; and nonprofits in USEPA Regions 1 & 3 who are interested in brownfields.

What Services Can TAB Provide?

NJIT provides a wide range of assistance, such as: reviewing and commenting on grant applications; developing grant management techniques; identifying and prioritizing sites; interpreting site characterization results; explaining clean up technologies; explaining regulatory requirements; developing strategies for site redevelopment; community engagement; and community visioning for redevelopment. Assistance is provided through direct technical mentoring, community workshops, seminars, webinars, an NJIT TAB website, telephone conversations, and email exchanges.
