Dear Ron,

In 2009 AMPO was a strong voice on the Hill and with the Administration during debates on the most pressing issues facing MPOs, including authorization, climate change, and transportation funding. AMPO was actively sought out by Congress and the Administration for ideas and suggestions on these topics. We were able to influence the discussion and the bills currently on the table through our active and engaged policy committee, membership, and board.

In the year ahead, these issues will continue to be debated and legislation refined as we head toward a transportation bill that will change the way we do business in metropolitan areas. AMPO's work over the past three years to develop a framework for transportation planning has helped us speak to these issues with authority. We also continue to advocate for restoring the rescinded transportation funds that have impacted many MPOs.

In addition to this important policy work, AMPO is working hard on the technical issues that MPOs address on a day-to-day basis. We began our MPO pooled funding project this year to conduct research into the use of advanced travel forecasting techniques. This work addresses several recommendations contained in the June 2007 TRB Special Report 288, Metropolitan Travel Forecasting: Current Practice and Future Direction. We will have the results of our important research in 2010. We will also convene our Work Groups on operations, travel modeling, and air quality/climate change in the upcoming year.
