- RE: Steering Committee Actions

At its meeting of April 7, 2006, the TPB Steering Committee approved the following resolution:

- TPB SR12-2006: on an Amendment to the FY2006-2011 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) that is exempt from the Air Quality Conformity Requirement to include three maintenance projects and three safety projects as requested by the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT).
- TPB SR13-2006: on changes to the Federal Functional Classification System of streets in the District of Columbia as requested by the District Department of Transportation (DDOT).

The TPB Bylaws provide that the Steering Committee "shall have the full authority to approve non-regionally significant items, and in such cases it shall advise the TPB of its action."

### RESOLUTION ON AN AMENDMENT TO THE FY 2006-2011 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) THAT IS EXEMPT FROM THE AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY REQUIREMENT TO INCLUDE THREE MAINTENANCE PROJECTS AND THREE SAFETY PROJECTS AS REQUESTED BY THE VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (VDOT)

WHEREAS, the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB), which is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Washington Region, has the responsibility under the provisions of Safe, Accountable, Flexible, and Efficient Transportation Equity Act - A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) for developing and carrying out a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process for the Metropolitan Area; and

**WHEREAS**, on October 19, 2005 the TPB adopted the 2005 Constrained Long-Range Transportation Plan (CLRP) and the FY 2006-2011 TIP; and

**WHEREAS,** in the attached letter of March 27, 2006, VDOT has requested an amendment to the FY 2006-2011 TIP to include three district-wide maintenance projects :

- bridge preventive maintenance, rehabilitation and replacement,
- traffic and safety operations; and
- pavement preventive maintenance and system preservation;

as well as three statewide safety projects:

- milling of centerline and shoulder rumble strips,
- upgrade to font and directional sign sheeting; and
- upgrade of pavement markings to B6 tape

**WHEREAS**, these projects are exempt from the air quality conformity requirement, as defined in Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations "40 CFR Parts 51 and 93 Transportation Conformity Rule Amendments: Flexibility and Streamlining; Final Rule," issued in the August 15, 1997 *Federal Register*,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Steering Committee of the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board amends the FY 2006-2011 TIP to include three district-wide maintenance projects : bridge preventive maintenance, rehabilitation and replacement, traffic and safety operations, and pavement preventive maintenance and system preservation; as well as three statewide safety projects: milling of centerline and shoulder rumble strips, upgrade to font and directional sign sheeting; and upgrade of pavement markings to B6 tape, as described in the attached materials.

Dear Chairman Knapp:

VDOT's Northern Virginia District Office requests amendments (attached) to the FY 2006-2011 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

FHWA, Virginia Division, and VDOT, Programming Division, have agreed to group maintenance projects (bridge, road, and operational maintenance) at the district level. Each MPO in the Commonwealth has been asked to amend its respective TIP to include these same three items.

- The <u>Bridge Preventative Maintenance, Rehabilitation and Replacement</u> item will provide for spot maintenance, testing, and routine rehabilitation of bridges as conditions warrant. Culvert structural boxes will be replaced under this item. Specific bridge rehabilitation and replacement projects are still listed individually, e.g., RT 28 over Broad Run and Washington Boulevard over Columbia Pike.
- The <u>Traffic Safety and Operations</u> item includes maintaining and replacing traffic devices and systems, signs, lighting, pavement markers, and safety studies.

> The Preventive Maintenance and System Preservation item focuses on pavement . maintenance and rehabilitation. This line item includes numerous projects and repair of road surfaces that need restoration before their scheduled maintenance work

Additionally, FHWA, Virginia Division, and VDOT, Programming Division, have agreed to group other maintenance projects at the state level under the categories of milling of centerline / shoulder rumble strips, upgrading of fonts and directional sign sheeting, and upgrading of pavement markings. These road safety improvements will be routinely incorporated into maintenance projects. If a roadway warrants the safety improvement before maintenance is scheduled, this fund will support these projects. VDOT, Programming Division has asked each MPO in the Commonwealth to amend its respective TIP to include these statewide road safety items.

VDOT believes that all of these maintenance and operational projects are categorically exempt from air quality conformity analyses.

VDOT requests that these amendments be approved by the TPB Steering Committee at its meeting on April 7, 2006.

WHEREAS, the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB), which is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Washington Region, has the responsibility under the provisions of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, and Efficient Transportation Equity Act - A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) for developing and carrying out a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process for the Metropolitan Area; and

**WHEREAS,** the Federal Functional Classification System of Streets for the District of Columbia was approved by the TPB in 1992; and

**WHEREAS,** revisions to the Federal Functional Classification System of Streets must be done in coordination and cooperation with the MPO; and

**WHEREAS,** in the attached letter of March 28, 2006, the District of Columbia Department of Transportation (DDOT) has requested changes to the map of the federal functional classification of selected streets, as described in the attached materials; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Steering Committee of the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board approves the changes to the map of the Federal Functional Classification System of Streets for the District of Columbia, as requested by DDOT and described in the attached materials.

Dear Mr. Kirby:

The District of Columbia Department of Transportation (DDOT) in cooperation with the Transportation Planning Board (TPB) conducted a review of the functional classification of selected streets. The review identified needed changes to the functional class map for several reasons including, but not limited to, the following:

- Obvious errors;
- Changes in land use;
- Changes in travel patterns and modes; and
- Travel restrictions imposed for security reasons.

The District seeks approval of these changes by the TPB. The list of proposed changes is attached to this letter.

The District of Columbia has unique roadway travel environments as a result of being the Nation's Capital and a destination for national and international tourism and business travelers. For these reasons, the eight standard FHWA-recommended criteria for classification were augmented by additional criteria and used to evaluate each proposed location. These additional criteria include special generators, commuter traffic, and homeland security. Detailed information about each proposed reclassification location is provided in the full reclassification report – which is also available on CD ROM.

TPB staff performed all the primary data collection and analysis. They also made the preliminary recommendations. DDOT staff (HPMS Coordinating Committee Members) reviewed the recommendations and provided their input.

All reclassification recommendations for each location were compiled and reviewed. Final decisions were based on recommendations that received majority approval. All of the recommendations provided by TPB staff were approved by the majority and accepted in full.

The percentage of District streets classified as "local" is fifty-nine percent (59%). FHWA guidelines for state roadway classification recommend that "local" streets should constitute at least sixty-five to eighty percent (65% to 80%) of all streets. As mentioned above, the District of Columbia is not a typical state. Its urban character, its high proportion of jobs to households, its boundaries with surrounding suburban jurisdictions containing multiple points of entry and its grid system of streets result in a high percentage of non-resident commuter and tourist travel over a large percentage of streets that, in other jurisdictions, would primarily serve only local residents. So, although the percentage of local streets appears to be low compared FHWA guidelines, this percentage is justified based on a technical analysis of the actual use of the District's roads.

DDOT hopes that these proposed changes can be considered and approved by the TPB Steering Committee at its next meeting on April 7<sup>th</sup>. If you or others have substantive questions about the proposed changes, please contact Mesfin Lakew at 202-671-4682.
