2. UPDATE ON PLANNING ACTIVITES FOR THE OCTOBER 21, 2008 EPC SENIOR LEADER SEMINAR FROM THE PLANNING TEAM

Participants were extremely pleased with the EPC Senior Leaders Seminar conducted in 2007 and so the EPC requested that ETOP develop and conduct another seminar in 2008 with emphasis on the private sector and emergency messaging. 6. ANTHRAX PUBLIC EDUCATION VIDEO

As part of the on-going planning for response to a terrorist attack using aerosolized anthrax, it is important for the public to understand the process of mass distribution of medication. In cooperation with R-ESF 8, Fairfax County has produced a video for use across the region on cable channels. Mr. Church will share the video and discuss the importance of recruiting volunteers to staff dispensing sites gaining public cooperation in the mass distribution process.

The fifth annual observation of National Preparedness Month will proceed with aggressive efforts to educate and involve residents in the National Capital Region in making emergency plans and supply kits for their homes and offices. The government public information officers and organizations that are part of R-ESF 15 – External Affairs are sponsoring a variety of community activities. R-ESF 15 also conducted research to measure the current preparedness of the NCR's residents; research results will be shared.
