Data sources and retail defined

Data sources:

- Historical employment data: Current Employment Statistics bls.gov/ces
- Historical establishment data: Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages bls.gov/qcew
- Projections data: BLS National Employment Matrix bls.gov/emp
- NAICS definition Sector 44-45: Retail Trade
 - "retailing merchandise generally in small quantities to the general public and providing services incidental
 to the sale of the merchandise."
 - Includes both store retailers ("fixed point-of-sale locations") and non-store retailers (e.g. catalogs, door-to-door sales, vending machines, etc.)
- E-commerce as retail?
 - There is an e-commerce retail industry ("electronic shopping industry")
 - However, this only constitutes 2.5 percent of retail employment in 2019
 - Employment for the storage, shipment, and delivery of packages all found in the "transportation and warehousing" industry separate from retail trade

Retail employment by sector, 2018

Industry	NAICS	Employment	Percent of retail
Retail trade	44, 45	15,833.1	
Motor vehicle and parts dealers	441	2,021.2	12.8%
Food and beverage stores	445	3,087.1	19.5%
General Merchandise stores	452	3,104.9	19.6%
All other retail	442-4, 446-8, 451, 453-4	7,619.9	48.1%




Retail trade, employment



- 2009-19: 1.1 million jobs added, 7.7 percent growth
- 2009-16: 1.3 million jobs added, 9.0 percent growth
- 2016-19: 187,600 jobs lost, 1.2 percent decline



E-Commerce sales growth



- E-commerce saw an accelerating share of overall retail sales over prior decade
 - Average annual share increases:
 - 2008-15: 0.49 percent
 - 2016-18: 0.85 percent



Electronic shopping and mail-order houses



- 2009-16: 121,600 jobs, 49.2 percent growth
- 2016-19: 18,400 jobs, 5 percent growth




General merchandise stores



- 2009-16: 203,200 jobs added, 6.9 percent growth
- 2016-19: 126,100 jobs lost, 4 percent decline



General merchandise stores, including warehouse clubs and supercenters



- 2009-16: 392,900 jobs added, 26 percent growth
- 2016-19: 58,000 jobs added, 3 percent growth




Department stores



2009-19: 373,800 jobs lost, 25.7 percent decline



General merchandise stores, establishments



- 2009-16: 10,440 establishments added, 20.2 percent growth
- 2016-18: 1,564 establishments added, 2.5 percent growth




Grocery stores



- 2009-16: 226,300 jobs added, 9.1 percent growth
- 2016-19: 16,900 jobs lost, 0.6 percent decline
- Technological factors also at work here: automated self-checkout systems replacing cashiers and retail salespersons



Grocery stores, establishments



- 2009-18: 4,061 establishments added, 4.8 percent growth
- 2014-18: 515 establishments lost, 0.6 percent decline




Clothing and clothing accessories stores



- 2009-16: 4,600 jobs lost, 0.3 percent decline
- 2016-19: 60,400 jobs lost, 4.4 percent decline



Clothing and clothing accessories stores, number of establishments



• 2009-18: loss of 9,083 establishments, 6.9 percent decline




Book stores and news dealers



- 2009-16: 44,200 jobs lost, 34.3 percent decline
- 2016-19: 6,200 jobs lost, 7.3 percent decline
- Book stores were one of the earliest detailed industries affected by e-commerce



Book stores and news dealers, establishments



2009-18: loss of 3,663 establishments, 33 percent decline




Gasoline stations



- 2009-19: 119,100 jobs added, 14.4 percent growth
- Consistent growth throughout ten-year period




Gasoline stations, establishments



• 2009-18: 2,066 establishments added, 2 percent growth




Motor vehicle and parts dealers



• 2009-19: 397,100 jobs added, 24.3 percent growth




Motor vehicle and parts dealers, establishments



• 2011-18: 3,836 establishments added, 3.4 percent growth




Transportation and warehousing



- 2009-16: 778,700 jobs added, 18.4 percent growth
- 2016-19: 614,900 jobs added, 12.3 percent growth




Retail Trade has the Greatest Decline of the Service Sector





Projections, 20018-28, retail trade vs. transportation and warehousing



- Retail trade
 - 153,700 jobs lost, 1 percent decline
- Transportation and warehousing
 - 322,300 jobs added, 5.9 percent growth



Retail-heavy occupations: retail salespersons and cashiers

- Retail salespersons (25.6 percent of retail industry employment, 2018)
 - Projected 2018-28:
 - 101,900 jobs lost
 - 2 percent decline
- Cashiers (18.8 percent of retail industry employment,
 2018)
 - Projected 2018-28:
 - 138,700 jobs lost
 - 4 percent decline
