Goals of the **CARES** Funded Food Security Activities

Increase	Access to healthy food and needed resources
Strengthen	Efficacy of hunger response activities
Improve	Planning and collaboration among partners
Reduce	Risk of exposure during pandemic
Provide	Information and outreach materials

Key Food Security Activities



Large scale distribution events by ALIVE! twice monthly—8,000 residents monthly



Pop-up distributions by ALIVE! and partners in key areas of greater need/limited access—1000+ residents monthly



Home delivery of groceries/frozen meals to older adults, quarantining, and at-risk families—1,500+ residents monthly (ALIVE! and Senior Services of Alexandria Meals on Wheels)



Support for pantries—1,000 residents monthly (ALIVE!, faith partners, and organizations)



Provision of food to families quarantining in hotels (ALIVE!)




Distribution of masks and other health and safety items during large-scale distribution efforts



Grocery Gift Card Distribution and Resilience Fund (ACT





ALX Cares Grocery Gift Card Program

- City of Alexandria contracted with ACT to provide grocery gift cards to eligible individuals and families through trusted partners
- Operated for six months: July 2020 to December 2020
- 3,034 families applied for the ALX Cares program
- 2,326 families received gift cards, which included 3,734 children
- 7,412 grocery gift cards were distributed
- \$2,519,000 was provided in grocery gift cards

ALX Cares Participant Information

Recipients were cost-burdened and struggling to afford basic needs, a challenge that Covid-19 had exacerbated

• 82% made less than \$25,000 per year, well below 50% Area Median Income

• 31% were receiving unemployment insurance

• 22% received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits

• 83% ran out of food routinely in the prior 12 months

ARPA Funded Food Security/Economic Mobility Efforts



Alexandria Community Access and Emergency Support Grant Program

- Navigation support to ensure individuals are enrolled in key local, state and federal programs for which they are eligible
- Provide tangible and emergency financial aid that will include grocery gift cards, transportation assistance, childcare, and rental assistance
- Trusted non-profit organizations will be selected through a grants process

Food Security System Advancement

- Creation of Food Security position to support city-wide efforts to combat food insecurity
- Establishment of two community food hubs in the West End and in Arlandria
- Large scale food distributions will occur monthly (increases will occur if indicated)
- •Continued support of pantry network, quarantine food, food delivery for seniors and ongoing operations

Food Resource Center/Food Hub Concept

Key Components:

- Client centered and accessible
- Choice in foods
- Help clients access/navigate other available services (city or private)
- Neighborhood space/co-located with other services
- Offered at times that are convenient for clients

Consultation with participants and partners on:

- Data collection and shared information
- Hours and location
- Rubric for how much and often people receive food
- What public services should be colocated and how often made available

Alexandria Guaranteed Income Pilot: ARISE

Monthly cash transfer of \$500

(pre-loaded debit card/direct deposit)

150+ families for 24 months

Case management, benefits counseling, other supports

Key Research component--assess the program's impact, informing policy changes
