Program History

- OTC Budget Trading Program (1999-2002)
- EPA NOx SIP Call (2003-2008)
- EPA Clean Air Interstate Rule (CAIR) (2005)
 - Replaced the NOx SIP Call
 - Was Vacated, Reconsidered, and then Remanded without Vacatur (2008)
- EPA Transport Rule (2010) (announced July 6)
 - New Rule to Replace CAIR and Respond to Court Directives





Key Elements of Transport Rule

EPA Modeling Used to
Determine Emission
Reduction Needed to
Remedy the
Requirement that
States Address
Contribution to
Downwind Areas

EPA to Implement FIPs by 2012, States have option to develop SIPs

2-step regulatory approach reduces NOx and SO₂ in 2012/2014

State-level Emission Budgets Established

Intra- and Inter-state Trading Limited

Only Addresses 1997
Ozone/annual PM
NAAQS and 2006
daily PM NAAQS.
Does not Address the
2008 Ozone NAAQS
currently under
Reconsideration

New Transport Rule Actions will Be Required

- Proposed Transport Rule Was Not Developed to Address New Lower Ozone or PM NAAQS
 - More stringent Ozone and PM NAAQS are expected
 - O3 in Aug 2010
 - PM in Oct 2011
 - Additional Reductions will be Required
 - Subsequent EPA Rulemakings are Planned

MWAQC Comment Letter

Key Points:

- Generally Support EPA's Proposed Remedy to CAA Section 110 and CAIR Remand
- Urge timely action to set tighter emission caps to enable new NAAQS Attainment
- Support Limited Emission Trading
