		At its February 16, 2005 meeting, the Board was briefed on the submissions received from state, regional and local agencies for the 2005 CLRP and the FY 2006-2011 TIP, which were released for public comment and agency review at the TPB Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting on February 10. Because additional information on the submissions has been received since February 10, it is recommended that the public comment period be extended by releasing the updated project submission information at the March 16 TPB meeting. This extended public comment period will close on April 15, 2005. At the April 20, 2005 meeting, the Board will be briefed on the comments received and the recommended responses, and asked to approve the submissions for inclusion in the air quality conformity analysis for the 2005 CLRP and the FY 2006-2011 TIP.

Mr. Philip Tarnoff University of Maryland

At the February 16, 2005 meeting, the Board was updated on actions regarding potential funding sources for a program, currently called CapCom, to strengthen communications and coordination during incidents. This program is to be undertaken by the region's transportation agencies through a partnership with the University of Maryland Center for Advanced Transportation Technology. The Board will be briefed on potential governance arrangements for the new Capcom partnership.

The new Congress has begun actions to reauthorize TEA-21, the six-year surface transportation act which expired September 30, 2003. The Board will be briefed on the key issues in the House and Senate proposals and on the legislative steps that need to occur before the expiration of the current extension of the law on May 31.
