Vision Zero in Arlington County

In July 2019, the County Board adopted <u>a</u> resolution committing to Vision Zero.

The Action Plan* will include:

- An assessment of existing safety needs/areas
- Goals for a safer transportation system
- A list of action items to achieve each safety goal
- A plan for tracking and reporting our progress

*The first Action Plan will cover a 5-year period.



Vision Zero is:

"a strategy to eliminate all traffic fatalities and severe injuries, while increasing safe, healthy, equitable mobility for all."






Jan – Feb 2020 Peer Review










Data Findings: Mapping

The High-Injury Network identifies where our most critical crashes are happening.

The roads on this map capture 78% of all serious or fatal crashes but comprises only 7% of the County's roadways.



Data Findings: Hot Spots


A review of **all crashes** (regardless of injury level) to identify locations for safety improvements

Conducted on an annual basis by County staff using the past three complete years of data

62% of Hot Spots Overlap with the High-Injury Network

Jul – Aug 2020 Plan for Phase II Engagement

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Outreach Efforts

- Hosted **public meetings** with over 30 live participants
- Posted both public meetings on the website
- Sent **postcards to 18,000+ homes** in hard-to-reach Census tracts
- Posted advertisements on 8o ART buses
- Posted reminders on the County's social media outlets
- Emailed to the Vision Zero and other County listervs
- Sent out through **APS channels**
- Sent messaging from ESG groups













Have you attended an Arlington County public meeting in the past




Which type of housing best describes your home?

Identify the **Top Three Challenges** that affect your ability to travel safely in Arlington













- 3. "Critical crashes" are defined as any crash that resulted in at least one severe or fatal injury.






Vision Zero is about changing the way that we do things.

Equity


 Prioritize investments and engagement in equity emphasis areas and on our HIN



Funding & Resources

- Establish a dedicated funding source for safety projects and programs
- Designate Vision Zero program staff







Data & Evaluation







- Safety Data Improvement
 - Improve crash data reporting processes and quality
 - Evaluate supporting data sources (citations, speeds, near misses, land use, etc.)



Crash Analysis

- Enhance annual crash analysis to focus on severe crashes and systemic issues
- Respond to severe crashes quickly through interdisciplinary analysis



Progress Reporting

- Report on progress annually (Annual Report) and actively (Website/Dashboard)
- Host an annual community benchmark survey on transportation safety
- Conduct before/after studies to inform future decisions



Process & Organization







Planning

- Update the Master Transportation Plan to encompass all modes with safety as a cornerstone
- Use safety and equity as project evaluation criteria



Design

- Review speeds and speed limits holistically
- Establish an engineering toolbox
- Revisit guidelines/policies for tool deployment



Operations & Maintenance

- Guide traffic enforcement activities with safety data
- Enhance infrastructure inventories
- Integrate safety needs as criteria for maintenance procedures
- Enhance the safety of active construction areas through planning and monitoring









Public Involvement

- Ensure community engagement efforts consider populations of all abilities, ages, languages, incomes, races, ethnicities, and neighborhoods
- Create a one-stop-shop on the County website to report safety or maintenance issues
- Broaden communication of transportation safety programs and projects



Education & Training

- Enhance community knowledge through targeted education efforts and programs
- Require County staff to participate in a Vision Zero training



Partnerships





Intra-agency

- Collaborate across departments on transportation safety activities
- Integrate Vision Zero principles into other County planning updates



Interagency

- Streamline coordination with VDOT on safety issues on state roadways
- Partner with neighboring jurisdictions, agencies, and other organizations on crossborder issues, infrastructure, regulations, and legislation



Collaborators

- Work with stakeholders (APS, commissions, etc.) to gather and share information
- Ensure County contractors are committed to safety and equity
- Coordinate on safe policies and operations with transportation service companies (TNCs, scooters, etc.)




Next Steps



- We will adjust and prioritize actions using input from:
 - Phase II Public Engagement (October 2020)
 - External Stakeholders Group (November 2020)
 - County Staff/Interdepartmental Stakeholders Group (Ongoing)
- We will continue to use feedback from these outlets to adjust and prioritize the actions.
- We plan to finalize the action list by late 2020.
