Notes

The **We Are Still In** pledge is an open letter signed by multiple types of entities, including universities, businesses, non-profits, and governments declaring that signatories will continue to support climate action to meet the Paris Agreement.

The **Mayors National Climate Action Agenda**, aka **Climate Mayors**, is a network of mayors that work together to strengthen local efforts for reducing greenhouse gas emissions and support binding federal and global-level policymaking.

The **US Climate Alliance** brings states together to reduce emissions 26%-28% from 2005 levels to meet or exceed the targets of the federal Clean Power Plan.

National League of Cities wrote a letter asking the President to protect the nation's environment through continued strong national leadership and commitment to the Paris climate agreement.

The **US Conference of Mayors** passed a resolution supporting a transition to 100% renewable energy through the **Mayors for 100% Clean Energy initiative**.
