ConnectGreaterWashington (CGW) is WMATA's regional transit system plan for 2040. As part of the Compact, WMATA is authorized to develop an operator and mode neutral long-range plan. It builds on the projects in the CLRP as well as the projects that help to maximize the existing Metrorail and Metrobus system outlined in Momentum (e.g. those projects in Metro 2025). The 2040 plan seeks to address crowding on the Metrorail system, provide additional high-frequency, high-capacity transit between regional activity centers, and provide connections between the myriad of local service that does not cross jurisdictional boundaries. This plan has been under development for some time and has been presented to the WMATA Board as well as to all of our partner jurisdictions over the years.
