SPEAKER BIOS

Sandra Brecher

Sandra Brecher is Chief of Commuter Services Section for the Montgomery County, Maryland, Department of Transportation. In that role she leads efforts to plan and promote use of alternatives to single occupant vehicle travel, to rduce traffic congestion, improve the environment, promote sustainable urban development and help address climate change. The office works with County employers, developers and property managers to incorporate Transportation Demand Management strategies; operates five Transportation Management Districts located in urban centers of the County; and operates two commuter stores.

Henry Dunbar

Since 2014, Henry Dunbar has been the Director of Active Transportation Operations for Arlington County Commuter Services, and oversees the BikeArlington, WalkArlington, Capital Bikeshare and Shared Micromobility programs. Previously he was executive director of Phoenix Bikes, an Arlington-based nonprofit organization training youth in basic bicycle mechanics, and has been working as a journalist and writer for government agencies, nonprofits, and newspapers in the DC region since 1988.

Gary Erenrich

Gary Erenrich is the Special Assistant to the Director in the Montgomery County Department of Transportation with primary responsibility for coordination with WMATA and MTA as well as regional planning at TPB. Gary Erenrich works closely with the County's Commuter Services, Master Planning, and both Capital Bikeshare and now dockless bikeshare. He has two engineering degrees from Northwestern University and a MBA from the University of Pittsburgh.

Sharada Strasmore

Sharada Strasmore is a Shared Micromobility Planner at District Department of Transportation. Her portfolio includes managing the permit process and liaising with the operators for dockless bike and scootershare and planning for parking of these vehicles. Sharada's passion for urban planning and active mobility came from experiencing the District on foot and by bike. Prior to joining DDOT, Sharada was a Capital City Fellow who rotated through the District Department of Human Services, Family Services Administration and the District Department of Transportation on both the Circulator



and dockless teams. Prior to that she worked at Goldman Sachs and the Peterson Institute for International Economics.
