The Technical Committee met on Friday, March 4 at COG. Six items were reviewed for inclusion on the TPB agenda on March 16.

• <u>TPB agenda Item 8</u>

The Committee was briefed on the proposed changes to the Virginia and Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) Technical Assistance Programs in the current FY 2005 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). The Committee recommended that TPB approve the proposed amendments to the FY 2005 UPWP.

• <u>TPB agenda Item 9</u>

Staff briefed the Committee on the revised final budget and the final draft FY 2006 UPWP (July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006). The Committee recommended that TPB approve the final FY 2006 UPWP.

The Committee recommended that TPB approve the scope of work for the air quality conformity assessment for the 2005 CLRP and FY 2006-2011 TIP.

• <u>TPB agenda Item 12</u>

Staff briefed the Committee on the status of staff work to develop proposals to restructure and streamline the Commuter Connections Work Program (CCWP) for FY 2006 (July 1,2005 through June 30, 2006).

• <u>TPB agenda Item 15</u>

Staff briefed the Committee on the results of the first and second years of the "Street Smart" pedestrian and bicycle safety education campaign and on a process to request local jurisdictions for regular annual funding commitments for this regional campaign. The Committee ask staff to revise the briefing for next month to include additional information on the causes of pedestrian and bicycle accidents and the benefits of the campaign. Two items were presented for information and discussion:

- The Committee was briefed on carpooling travel trends and commuting patterns in the region.
- Staff briefed the Committee on a draft report on the performance of the 2004 CLRP in terms of accessibility to jobs, and the potential impact of the plan on minority, low-income, and disabled populations.
