- 2.1 Develop programming that highlights the significant historical, recreational and educational value of the park and river.
- 2.2 **Actively promote the improvement to the health** of the Anacostia River.

Goal 3: Envision an Inspiring Future

of the Anacostia Waterfront for generations to come.



To be approved as a Year of the Anacostia event, your event must:


- Be relevant to the environmental, social, cultural, historical or economical value of the Anacostia River watershed.
- Offer inclusion to diverse audiences with various demographic backgrounds.
- Provide a meaningful experience or engagement.
- Preserve and not damage the resource.


When is the deadline and how does the process work?

- To be promoted through Year of the Anacostia outreach and newsletters, you must submit your event at least four weeks in advance of the event date.
- If you plan to host your Year of the Anacostia event in Anacostia Park, additional permits from the National Park Service will be needed.




