## U.S. Transportation Secretary Visits COG, Signs TIGER Grants

Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood came to COG in December to sign \$58.8 million in TIGER grants for the National Capital Region. The \$58.8 million in Recovery Act money will improve bus transportation along priority corridors in the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia, and create better connections between buses and other forms of transportation in the region. The grant signing and the Secretary's visit were covered by the *The Washington Post*, the *Washington Business Journal*, the *Washington Examiner*, TBD, WUSA 9, PGC-TV, WTOP, and Univision.
