





About the TPB


- National Capital Region
 Transportation Planning Board
 (TPB) is the federally designated
 Metropolitan Planning
 Organization (MPO) for the region
- Plays an important role as the regional forum for transportation planning
- Prepares plans and programs that the federal government must approve in order for federal-aid transportation funds to flow to metropolitan Washington





The Constrained Long-Range Transportation Plan (CLRP)

- Developed cooperatively by the region's transportation and transit agencies
- A long-range transportation plan fully updated every four years (last in 2014), with smaller amendments on an annual basis
- Over 500 regionally significant transportation projects, ranging from simple landscaping projects to billion-dollar highway and transit projects.
- Based on policy documents:
 - TPB Vision (1998)
 - Regional Transportation Priorities Plan (2014)





New Federal Planning Requirements


- In May, 2016, the USDOT published a final rule on Statewide and Metropolitan Transportation Planning
 - Updates federal regulations with changes adopted in the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) and the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act
- Adds intermodal facilities and inclusion of intercity bus and commuter vanpool providers in the planning process
 - Adds intercity bus operators to the list of interested parties that MPOs shall provide early and continuous public involvement opportunities as part of the transportation planning process
 - MPO transportation plans shall include consideration of intercity buses



2018 Update to the CLRP

- Incorporate new planning requirements
- Horizon year of 2045
- Elements now in progress:
 - Public outreach input on projects and programs in the plan
 - Opportunity for intercity bus providers, vanpool operators, and other providers of public transportation to comment
 - Financial analysis forecasts of revenues and of project and program costs
- Next steps
 - Call for Projects from the region Fall 2017/Winter 2018
 - Air quality and performance analysis Spring/Summer 2018
 - Must be approved by October 2018





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
