Introduction

 - Adapted from presentation given by Ron Milone to the Travel Forecasting Subcommittee Sept. 19
- This is a regular but important part of ensuring the success of our planning program
- Ongoing this fall, with certification-specific review meetings scheduled for late October
- This is for information, no specific action is needed from MOITS

What is a Federal Certification Review?

- A formal review of the approaches, activities and issues associated with the metropolitan transportation planning process
- Federal requirement for all Transportation Management Areas (TMAs)
 - SAFETEA-LU planning requirements are in effect;
 MAP-21 requirements will not take effect for another year or two
- Conducted by FHWA and FTA every four years
- Last review of the TPB was conducted in 2010

Sequential Phases of the Review

- Desk review of planning products and processes
- 2. Issuance of desk review findings
- 3. Site visit
- 4. Verbal close out
- 5. Report of the finalized certification review
